## Eight New Lutheran Blind Mission Outreach Centers — \$40,000

Today there are more than 55 million blind and visually impaired people, most of whom have not found the comfort and refuge of Jesus.



Lutheran Blind Mission is reaching the blind with the saving message of Jesus through their outreach centers. With already 40 of these centers established, the blind are given a place to go and socialize, have meals, obtain materials, and receive occupational training.

Plans are to increase the number of outreach centers to 75 by the end of 2008. This is an ambitious goal and needs the assistance of the LWML.

A grant of \$40,000 enables Lutheran Blind Mission to reach its goal of increasing the number of new blind outreach centers.



## Outreach Ministry to the Homeless and Addicted – Detroit — \$49,000

"I was hungry and you fed me, I was naked and you gave me clothes." These words of Jesus remind us that those in need are gifts from Him, that we may serve them with His gifts.

Lutheran City Ministries Family of God in Southwest Detroit sees the homeless, the addicted, the battered, and the mentally challenged as those whom the Lord gave us to serve. They serve these individuals both spiritually and physically by providing Bible study, worship, interventions, shelter, and food, while also providing opportunities for congregations to assist them in their service to this community.

With over 25,000 homeless and more addicted in the Detroit area, Family of God's ministry has grown and is in need of better facilities and resources.

A grant of \$49,000 helps fund the outreach efforts of Lutheran City Ministries to the homeless, addicted, poor, and mentally challenged in Southwest Detroit.



## Portable Medical Clinics for the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Sudan — \$70,000

Sudan — Africa's largest country with a population of 29.5 million — is ravaged by civil war, with an estimated 60 percent of its people suffering from malnutrition and starvation.

The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Sudan has worked closely with LCMS World Relief and Human Care to provide education, medical, and hospital needs to the Sudanese people. All this is done in an effort to demonstrate Christ's love to those seeking refuge both physically and spiritually.

Portable medical clinics are needed in Malakal (in the Upper Nile Province) and in Bauga (in the Equatoria Province) to provide preventative and proactive diagnostic care as well as routine examinations and some minor surgical procedures.

A grant of \$70,000 delivers two finished portable medical clinics to Malakal and Bauga, Sudan.
