Transportation — \$60,000**

The Word of God is a precious gift to all who would hear and read it. But how can one hear and read the Bible if it is not in their native language? Lutheran Bible Translators takes on the challenge of translating this precious Word so people of all nations hear the Good News of Jesus.

LBT missionaries serve in some of the most remote areas of the world where traveling is very difficult. Presenting the Gospel of Jesus Christ in the language of the people requires a great deal of in-country travel. Having a safe and reliable vehicle is essential for these missionaries.

They rely on these vehicles to reach and work with remote people groups. Vehicles also provide safety for emergency evacuations that are sometimes necessary in dangerous regions.

A grant of \$60,000 provides safe and reliable transportation for recently appointed LBT missionaries.

**Lutheran Campus Ministry at Haskell Indian Nations University, Lawrence, Kansas — \$95,000**

Haskell Indian Nations University in Lawrence, Kansas, is the most well known Native American University in the U.S. with over 900 students.

The Lutheran Student Ministry there — known as Haskell LIGHT — proclaims Jesus, the True Light, to the university students. Many of these students are homesick and troubled and find a place of comfort and refuge at the LIGHT house.

The directors, Will and Patricia Mains, provide programs for Bible study and Christian counseling, as well as identify, recruit, and equip Native American youth to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ back to their home communities.

A grant of \$95,000 helps fund the campus ministry at Haskell Indian Nations University.
